

After falling in love with birdwatching during the COVID-19 pandemic, Emily started making her own edible, ornamental arrangements for backyard birds. Soon, she turned this love into a creative small business. She now sells her ornaments in three stores in the Conception Bay North region and takes plenty of online orders.

TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF


My name is Emily Steele. I moved to Harbour Grace in 2010 and run Sweet Tweats as a home-based business.

HOW DID SWEET TWEATS START?

It all started during the COVID-19 lockdown.

We were all stuck inside, not going out much, and of course people started taking up different hobbies. Spring is a popular time for backyard bird feeding, and I became really interested with the varieties of birds in my backyard—the blue jays, sparrows, juncos. I started making some ornamental birdfeeder decorations as a hobby; and eventually, I had too many for my own use. My mom and I reached out to CBDC in Carbonear, and they helped us with a plan to sell our extras. Soon enough, I'm running my own small business based around my love of backyard birds. I now sell over sixty shapes of bird feeder decorations.





HOW CAN PEOPLE SUPPORT YOUR BUSINESS?

I currently stock my 'sweet tweats' at Best Kind General Store & Boutique and Sharon's Drive-In in Harbour Grace, and if you're in Carbonear, you can buy them at Balance Wellness on Goff Avenue.

WHY HARBOUR GRACE?

Some of my shapes take inspiration from this story, such as the ship's anchor for the SS Kyle and the hook for Peter Easton. I love to watch the birds near the kiosk at the trail, next to the museum, and the wetlands at the SS Kyle site. I saw a bald eagle today, actually!






YOUR FAVOURITE BIRD?
