On behalf of my colleagues on Council and all residents of the historic Town of Harbour Grace, I'm proud to present the new edition of **The Heart of the Harbour**, our seasonal community newsletter.

Council is presently working on its ten-year strategic plan review, and we're happy to re-engage with residents and share the progress of our plan. We have lots of exciting projects in the works for 2024. With funding from the province and the Government of Canada, ongoing **restorations at Otterbury Schoolhouse** include an energy-efficient heating unit, accessible washroom, upgraded electrical capacity, and insulation. This building will provide a valuable multiuse space for our volunteer groups. **LeMarchant Street** is set for new water, sewer, and street upgrading this spring. Also, with significant financial help from ACOA and the province, we'll soon be digging ground on phase I of the **Heritage District Development Project**, which will beautify our downtown with new pedestrian infrastructure. We hope these capital works projects will make Harbour Grace a livable community for residents and businesses, a place you're proud to call home.

#### **TOWN HALL NOTICES**

- A discount of 4% on 2024 taxes will be offered until Feb. 28, 2024. For the discount to be valid, payment must be received at the Town Hall by 5 p.m. sharp on this date. This deadline includes online banking payments, which may take up to five business days for processing. The due date for 2024 taxes is June 30.

- The Harbour Grace Volunteer Fire Brigade encourages residents with fire hydrants near their properties to do their best to keep hydrants accessible during the winter. Unimpeded hydrant access is vitally important during an emergency.
- For those venturing onto frozen ponds for recreation, please be mindful of ice conditions and stay away from areas with running water and brooks. Make somebody aware of where you're going and your anticipated time of return.
- Make sure to check with the Town Hall prior to doing any work on your property—a **permit** may be required. Our permits can be downloaded online at www.townofharbourgrace.ca or picked up at the Town Hall.
- Frozen water lines are a frequent problem for residents during the winter months. We recommend leaving water running slowly if you are concerned about water lines freezing. Frozen water lines are the responsibility of the homeowner, and the Town will not dig up water lines during the winter months.
- For everyone's safety on our roads, please stay back 50 meters from Public Works heavy equipment this winter season. Avoid street parking during heavy snowfalls as snow clearing equipment require safe access.
- If you notice a street light out in the community, call the Town Hall and we'll report the issue to Newfoundland Power. When calling, please detail the area and the specific street light number.
